## **COURSE OVERVIEW**

Since January 2018 surveyors have been enforcing the requirement for healthcare facilities to inspect, test and maintain fire and smoke doors. The 2012 Life Safety Code expects all healthcare organizations to be compliant with the requirements including the NFPA 80-2010 edition, which requires all fire-rated door assemblies to be inspected annually.

During this presentation we will review the requirements for annual inspections and review the qualified training necessary to complete the fire door inspection and provide facilities the necessary documentation tools to complete these.
